2004 — What a Year!

Just when we thought the library couldn't get any busier, it did. From library cards to summer reading to reference questions, the numbers continue to grow.

Once again we broke all the records. Here's a quick look at the figures for 2004:

- Almost 900 square feet were added with the construction of The Library Café, a storage area, and an improved book donation shelter.
- Nearly 1.5 million items were checked out, 40% using the self-checkout machines.
- 2,864 children and 483 teens participated in this year's summer reading program.
- Every month we added over 2,700 new items to the collection.
- Secondhand Prose, the Friends of the Canton Public Library used bookstore, averaged \$3,000 in monthly sales.
- Friends of the Canton Public Library membership increased more than 60%.
- Over 15,000 kids attended one of the 400 children's programs.
- Our children's and adult reference desks answered around 8,000 patron questions every month.
- Close to 10,000 new patrons received Canton Public Library cards this year.

Electronic Mail Beats Both Telephone and Printed Notices

The library notifies users that holds are ready to be picked up and materials are due back in several ways. One is printed notices that are sent via the postal service. These notices list titles and are sent to the individual on whose card materials are checked out, or who reserved items. Another is telephoned recordings, which do not give titles nor is the individual named (for privacy reasons). The third is email.

- No paper or postage costs to the library (your tax dollars can be used elsewhere!)
- Sent daily except Sunday
- Titles are listed
- Goes directly to the individual
- Reminder message sent just before the due date

The next time you come to the library, stop at the Checkout Desk and give our staff your email address so you can try it yourself!

2500 Students Get Library Cards

Thank you to all of the parents, students and teachers who made our first cooperative library card campaign a big success. This collaboration between the Canton Public Library, the Plymouth District Library and the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools sought to promote reading and increase literacy by encouraging students to use the public libraries. The project results are impressive — more than 2,500 new library cards were issued to students from kindergarten through twelfth grade, and over 1,700 of those new cards went to students living in Canton.

Any student who still needs a library card can get one by visiting the Checkout Desk at the library with photo ID and proof of address — an accompanying parent's ID is acceptable. We look forward to seeing you!

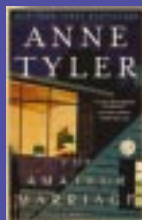

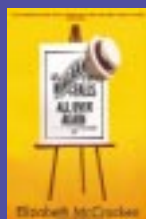

Test Prep Tip: Vocabulary Flash Cards

Having a solid vocabulary will help you succeed on standardized tests. Here's a great way to build your vocabulary:

1. Buy a stack of basic index cards.
2. Borrow a vocabulary book from the Canton Public Library.
3. Write the vocabulary word on the unruled side of the card.
4. Write the definition on the ruled side of the card.



Spend a few minutes each day reviewing your cards and adding new words. As you practice with the cards, your vocabulary will grow and you will recognize more words in the reading passages of the exams.

With a little creativity and planning, winter can be a great time for family fun. Try these cold weather boredom busters!

Outdoor Activities:

- tubing or Sledding** Find a hill and take your sled or tube for safe but exciting thrills.
- Snow Paint** Add food coloring to water bottles with squirt tops and head outside to create beautiful snow paintings.
- Animal Tracks** See if you can find the tracks of dogs, cats, birds and other wildlife in the snow.
- Go for a Walk** Point out how nature changes. What do tree branches look like without leaves? Can you find the abandoned bird nests?
- Catch Snowflakes** Take a black piece of paper outside to catch falling snowflakes. Use a magnifying glass to look at them closely.

Indoor Activities:

- Bake Cookies** Everyone loves the smell of cookies baking. Get cozy with a warm cookie fresh from the oven and a cup of hot cocoa.
- Bird Feeder** Most children love birds and would enjoy making a bird feeder to help their feathered friends.

- Glaciers** Fill a bowl with snow and let it thaw a little indoors, then put it back outside to refreeze. Later, add more snow and repeat the process to create a mini-glacier with "layers" of ice and snow.
- Ice Paint** Make an ice cube paintbrush by poking craft sticks into partially frozen ice cubes and then freeze solid. Sprinkle powder paint on a piece of paper and use the ice cube paintbrush to make designs.
- Read** Cuddle under a warm blanket with a good book.

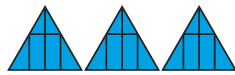
