A Canton Public Library card is the smartest card in your wallet. It saves you time, saves you money and gets you to places you've only dreamed of going.



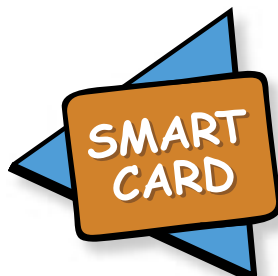

What Does It Mean?

When you use the self-checkout machines, you might encounter one of these messages. In most cases they are just reminders that we need to check your contact information for accuracy. Every three years, your library record needs to be updated so we have current contact information to send courtesy and other circulation notices, giving you the option to renew your materials and avoid overdue fines.

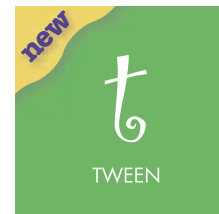
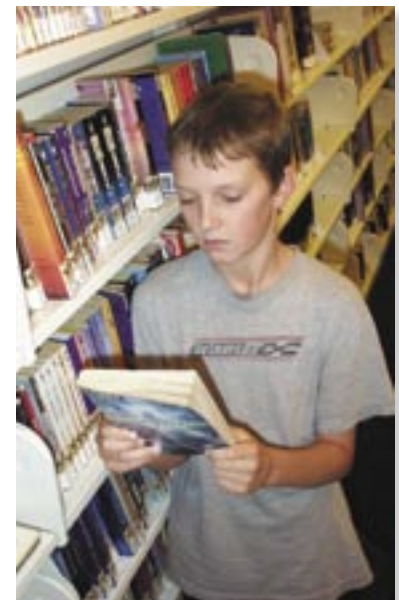
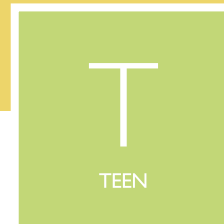
Not For Children Only
